


Why agrifood systems-change needs Co-Funding

We are working together in service of European agrifood systems that continuously increase their social, ecological and economic health, and life-holding capacity.






The Consortium informs the thesis of our Co-Funding Alliance and is a representative group of leaders from across the agrifood system in Europe.





Intervention Pathways defined by our Knowledge Partner

The following pathways provide initial guidance for our funding thesis



Interdependence of human and ecosystem health

Designing policies, frameworks and actions based on the underlying premise that humans exist within nested ecosystems (from soil to water cycles) and all are utterly interdependent for mutual long term resilience and flourishing.



Farmers as stewards of living systems

Acknowledging European farmers as agents and stewards of social health and wellbeing, natural resources and climate resilience through reformed policy, strengthened farmer networks and equitable land access policies.



Agrifood industry leaders as stewards of living systems

Removing barriers that prevent the potential of private sector leaders to rethink and reform business models and value chains in ways that support farmers' agency, long-term market health and increased trust.



Research and education serves a living systems paradigm

Enabling knowledge creators to center their research in an understanding of systems as alive, whole and complex and for educators, including researchers, to share this knowledge in the same spirit.
